FAA's Current Status

AUTHORIZATION

- We are operating under Public Law 115-254 (FAA Reauthorization Act of 2018)
- <u>Authorizes</u> \$3,350,000 in AIP for the period beginning on October 1, 2018, ending on September 30, 2023

APPROPRIATION

- We are operating under Public Law 116-260, titled "Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021" (signed by the President on December 27, 2020)
- <u>Appropriated</u> \$3,350,000,000 in FY 2021 for airport planning and development and noise compatibility planning and program ending on <u>September 30, 2021</u>



What is the difference between an authorization and appropriation?

Authorization

Appropriation

Provides funds for authorized programs Allows the FAA to exist as an agency ٠ Provides for the use of funds Authorizes the imposition of ticket taxes & • ٠ the use of those revenues flowing into & Can provide additional funds other than out of the Airport and Airway Trust Fund ٠ authorized Establishes basic statutory authorities & • Can have special allocations/funding rules ٠ obligations (for FAA, airports, airlines & other users, & other stakeholders) Annual bill – needed each year for funding ٠ Gives FAA the authority to spend money -• if & when it's appropriated Multi-year bill

2021 Airport Improvement Program (AIP)

• 2021 AIP

- Regular local match rules apply
- March 15th sponsors to notify FAA they plan on taking FY-2021 grant
- May 3rd Sponsors submit final grant application (based on bids)
- We will be issuing e-Grants & Certifications
- Start processing closeouts electronically



Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act

- The <u>Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act (H.R.</u> <u>748, Public Law 116-136)</u> (PDF), signed into law by the President on March 27, 2020
- \$10 billion in funds to be awarded as economic relief for prevention of, preparation for, and response to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The CARES Act provided funds to increase the federal share to 100 percent for Airport Improvement Program (AIP) and supplemental discretionary grants awarded in FY2020.



Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriation (CRRSA) Act

- The <u>Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriation</u> (CRRSA) Act (H.R. 133) (PDF), signed into law by the President on December 27, 2020
- \$2 billion in funds awarded as economic relief to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) public health emergency.
- FAA established the Airport Coronavirus Response Grant Program (ACRGP) to award CRRSA grants.



Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriation (CRRSA) Act

- Airports <u>must apply</u> for the grants by June 30, 2021
- Funds are available until **September 30, 2021**, and <u>must be obligated</u> by that date. FAA intends to award grants and obligate these funds on an expedited basis.
- CRRSA Grants under the Airport Coronavirus Response Grant Program are available at a **100% Federal share**.
- CRRSA <u>does not</u> provide funding to increase the Federal share to 100% on FY 2021 AIP or Supplemental Discretionary grants




- First Drawdown & Regular Drawdowns

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2 CFR 200 Closeout Updates

- 2 CFR 200 was updated in mid to late fall of 2020 and included substantial changes to Sponsor and FAA Closeout Requirements.
- These changes became effective November 12, 2020.
 - <u>All FY2021 Grants</u> are subject to the changes.
- Revised closeout period below.





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Grant Closeout

In order for the ADO to close a grant, must complete three basic steps:

- 1. Physically complete all projects in the grant
- 2. Complete all grant administrative and financial requirements
- 3. Provide Final Closeout Report -

Outlining Final payment Requests

- Full Payment; or
- Partial Payment Recoop funds; or
- Amendment Needed (section 7, Ch 5 AIP HB)

1. PURPOSE

This Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) establishes uniform procedures for the closure of Airport Improvement Program (AIP) grants for the Office of Airports (ARP) in a manner compliant with applicable ARP orders and federal financial requirements.


\$20,636,795 all in (Entitlement, State Apportionment, Discretionary, CARES Match)

- Studies and reports still needed to be submitted!
- If your project is not going to be ready, please let us know!



Closeouts

- 27 Closeouts have been submitted
- 2017 projects must be closed this fiscal year due to Period of Performance
- Three 2017 open grants in South Dakota remain open. We currently have closeouts for all
- Need to have these submitted before June for review / processing of final payments



Buy American



- Completed content percentage worksheet and final assembly questionnaire.
- Proprietary information may be forwarded to the FAA directly.
- The FAA may revoke waivers, request additional information, and conduct reviews to enforce compliance to Buy American requirements.
- Process times will vary.
- Submit completed forms to Airport District Office associated with the airport worksite where the product [project] is to be awarded.





- If approved, the FAA notifies the airport sponsor and manufacturer.
- Approved waivers are posted to the AIP Buy American Preference Requirements webpage under Waivers Open for Comment.
- Approved waiver is open for public comment for 10 days.
- Approved waivers become effective on day 11 and available for use on an AIP funded project.
